The chilling story of Saviour
Kasukuwere 's rise to power,
his evil plot and plans

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Early Days

Dear Nelson Chamisa, Blessed Geza, and others,
I hope this dossier finds you well. I am writing to introduce you to the true hand of deception Tyson. The title of this dossier is "The Dark Agenda."

You may suspect this to be a smear campaign or a counter-intelligence operation, but I assure you, my intentions are sincere. My goal is to open your eyes to the true nature of the man you are about to align yourselves with, Saviour Kasukuwere. His biography is not important what is important is his ambition and journey to power which we will pick up from the year 2000.

In one example, on the 13th April 2000 a group of 300 MDC supporters tried to hold a rally in Mt Darwin. Kasukuwere, then a parliamentary candidate in upcoming elections, ordered the police to mount roadblocks and turn back everyone attending. Skirmishes arose and several were injured.

Kasukuwere, on the 5th May 2008, organized and ferried a group of over 300 youths to Chaona, Mazowe where a lot of people were seriously injured and six people were killed. The youths were wearing Kasukuwere's campaign T- shirts.

Eight days later the same mob, led by Kasukuwere, is alleged to have been responsible for the murder of Fischer Chitese, Bright Mafuriro and Sairiro Kamufuto. On the 19th May the group struck again, killing MDC activist Phanuel Mubaira. Kasukuwere, unlike most ZANU PF chefs who simply direct the violence, has the rare distinction of actually being a willing participant in the brutality.

These are some of the few examples that Nelson Chamisa should remember. Kasukuwere does not believe in democracy, he believes in power. Kasukuwere is on a quest to attain power by any and all means possible. Beware of any deals or association with Kasukuwere he is the hand of the devil and he will corrupt you and your brand of politics which is God oriented and centred. Kasukuwere believes in himself and his abilities not in God or any higher power unless if it is black magic and charms then Kasukuwere will believe in it.

Tyson in mainstream politics

ZANU PF had a history of normal political contests since its inception. In Harare, there were rivalries involving Tavengwa, Chigumba, Savanhu, and Gara. Bulawayo saw tensions between Edson Ncube and Dabengwa, while in Manicaland, figures like Didymus Mutasa, Kangai, Manyonda, and Oppah engaged in political battles. These contests were characterized by political showmanship, where comrades competed against each other in a spirited yet respectful manner.

However, this dynamic changed when Kasukuwere entered ZANU PF's main-wing politics.

The hand of the devil at work

Kasukuwere in mainstream politics brought the hand of the devil in full force. Strange things started happening in ZANU PF.

The deaths of party political commissar Border Gezi on 28 April, Defence Minister Moven Mahachi on 26 May, and of the 'war veterans' leader Chenjerai 'Hitler' Hunzvi on 4 June were caused by the hand of the devil. This was unheard of and all fingers were quietly pointing at Saviour Kasukuwere. Same Kasukuwere who was fingered by security operatives as being behind the Zvobgo mysterious accident of 1996.

With each strategic death Kasukuwere was rising through the ranks as gaps opened up.

Kasukuwere as an ex intelligence operative with the financial muscle he was capable of executing his own rogue operations to suit his dark agenda. ZANU PF never knew peace when Kasukuwere joined mainstream politics. The power hungry Kasukuwere was stopping at nothing.

The scheming gets worse

2004

Kasukuwere enjoyed the support and favour of General Solomon Mujuru. He used this relationship to secure a direct line to Mugabe where he could whisper his gossip and rumours in the form of intelligence reports. Kasukuwere knew that Phillip Chiyangwa was the face of indigenisation in Zimbabwe and if Kasukuwere were to be Minister he would have to get Chiyangwa out of the race.

Kasukuwere engineered a sneaky operation which got Chiyangwa, then an MP and Dzvairo, former consul-general at Zimbabwe's embassy in South Africa, arrested and charged along with Zanu-PF's director for external affairs, Itai Marchi and Tendi Matambanadzo, a director of a locally owned bank, Metropolitan. They were charged with some form of espionage. With this on his record Chiyangwa was now out of the race for a cabinet position.



2004 gets worse

2004 is the year Chiyangwa was arrested and the sad passing of Edson Zvobgo also happened in 2004.

Why is Zvobgo important to this story? Well, in December 2003 Edson Zvobgo called for the establishment of a well funded anti corruption commission which would subsequently go after people like Kasukuwere. Zvobgo stirred the hornet's nest when he said there was a class of corrupt politician in ZANU PF, this class of people has built mansions which he described as obscene, and which he said cost more than the owners lawfully earned.

He said he had personal knowledge that some corrupt individuals had taken the opportunity during the recent land reform program to seize up to five formerly white owned farms each. He said this should be investigated by a well-staffed anti-corruption commission. Kasukuwere was one such person targeted by the outspoken Zvobgo. A few months from this statement Zvobgo met his end in hospital.

These hand of the devil exploits earned Kasukuwere the nickname Paraquat .Paraquat, also known as N, N'-dimethyl-4,4'-bipyridinium dichloride, is a lethal toxic organic compound with no known antidote for poisoning.



2005 Cabinet but it gets worse

In 2005, Zimbabwe held elections, and Saviour Kasukuwere secured a cabinet position, though only as a Deputy Minister. However, for the ambitious Kasukuwere, this was not enough he had bigger plans and a few tricks up his sleeve.

Determined to cement his reputation as a ZANU PF hardliner, Kasukuwere saw aligning with senior party hawks like Solomon Mujuru and Sydney Sekeramayi as his best path to influence. In 2006, when former South African Minister of State Security Ronnie Kasrils was tasked by then-South African President Thabo Mbeki and UN Secretary-General Kofi Annan to facilitate negotiations for President Mugabe's resignation in exchange for a Transitional Authority and financial rescue package, Kasukuwere played a key role in derailing the deal.

He aggressively lobbied Politburo members and even threatened party moderates such as Nathan Shamuyarira, Simba Makoni, and Herbert Murerwa. His efforts succeeded—Mugabe rejected the deal outright, and Mbeki's quiet diplomacy on Zimbabwe collapsed before it could gain traction. This cemented Kasukuwere's status as a hardliner, earning him the same respect as those who had fought in the liberation war.

Yet Kasukuwere faced another challenge: Simba Makoni was widely regarded as the party's dark horse, a favorite among both the membership and the public for the presidency. Determined to remove him from contention, Kasukuwere leveraged his close ties to Solomon Mujuru and Dumiso Dabengwa to plant the idea of a breakaway faction within ZANU PF.

While the proposal had its strategic merits, Kasukuwere framed it as a calculated move to clear the way for either Joyce Mujuru or Solomon Mujuru to claim the presidency without facing Makoni as a challenger. Makoni was led to believe he would have public backing from Mujuru and others at a press conference announcing the split, but when the moment arrived, only Dabengwa showed up leaving Makoni politically stranded and isolated.

2005 Operation Murambatsvina

Dear Nelson Chamisa, It gets worse and, unfortunately, this is the man you are considering partnering with in politics. Trusting him, or anything he is involved in, is entirely at your own risk.

In early 2005, at a Joint Operations Command (JOC) meeting held at State House in Bulawayo, Saviour Kasukuwere proposed Operation Murambatsvina. To this day, how he gained access to that high-level meeting remains a mystery. The senior officials present included Maynard Muzariri, Augustine Chihuri, Bevan Murahwa, Paradzai Zimondi, Andrew Muzonzini, Nicholas Goche, Sidney Sekeramayi, and Didymus Mutasa, among others. Despite being the most junior person in the room, Kasukuwere was given the floor to push for Operation Murambatsvina a brutal, anti-people operation designed to punish urban dwellers for supporting the opposition. Although Ignatius Chombo, then Minister of Local Government, was tasked with implementing it, he had no role in its conception. He was merely a tool used to execute a policy meant to discredit him while advancing Kasukuwere's personal agenda.

True to form, Kasukuwere capitalized on the fallout from Operation Murambatsvina, manipulating key players, striking backroom deals, and further entrenching his influence. On December 15, 2006, at Goromonzi High School in Mashonaland East, he once again demonstrated his political maneuvering by pushing for a resolution to defer elections to 2010. This move was intended to block Mugabe from retiring in 2008 something the president had hinted at but never explicitly confirmed.

Kasukuwere's ultimate goal was clear: he did not want Mugabe to step down before he had secured a place in the upper echelons of power. However, the power dynamics soon shifted. General Solomon Mujuru and other senior party figures had their own plans, and they ultimately outmaneuvered Kasukuwere. This internal power struggle contributed to the disastrous 2008 election, which forced Mugabe into a negotiated settlement the very outcome Kasukuwere had vehemently opposed earlier. Still, Kasukuwere had delivered Mashonaland Central to the table, solidifying his position among ZANU PF's power brokers. By then, he had earned his seat at the table with the political heavyweights.

The hand of the devil and his horns

The devil revealed his hand—and his horns—during the Government of National Unity (GNU). He launched what became known as the Obama Project, assembling a coalition of young political figures to position himself as the natural successor to Mugabe. His path to power was clear: eliminate General Solomon Mujuru, sideline Joyce Mujuru, befriend General Chiwenga, and push Emmerson Mnangagwa out of the race. It was an ambitious and dangerous plan, but Paraquat—as he was known—was a cunning operator well-versed in the political and security landscapes. However, to succeed, he needed significant spiritual and strategic backing to ensure his enemies never saw him coming.

The Mysterious Death of General Mujuru

The first major obstacle was General Solomon Mujuru, and his untimely death under suspicious circumstances played perfectly into Kasukuwere's hands. Reports suggest that Saviour Kasukuwere was the last person to see the General alive. Given his well-documented thirst for power, it is no surprise that Mujuru's sudden demise paved the way for Kasukuwere to rise. With Mujuru gone, the only remaining hurdle in his way was Joyce Mujuru.

At the same time, Sydney Sekeramayi, another potential rival, was widely seen as a political lightweight, lacking the independent influence to challenge the status quo. Kasukuwere often dismissed him as a mere Mugabe loyalist with no real political standing.



Using Grace Mugabe to Take Down Joyce Mujuru

With the General out of the picture, Kasukuwere ingratiated himself into Grace Mugabe's inner circle. Using his proxies—such as Kazembe Kazembe—he facilitated Grace's acquisition of land in Mashonaland Central for her orphanage and school, securing her trust. Once inside, he masterminded the rift between Grace and Joyce Mujuru, which soon escalated into a direct confrontation between Mugabe and Joyce.

Kasukuwere manipulated intelligence reports, fabricated evidence, and engineered Joyce Mujuru's downfall, ensuring her removal from ZANU PF. With her exit, he was one step closer to his ultimate goal.

The Final Target: Emmerson Mnangagwa

With Joyce gone, Mnangagwa became the next threat, and Kasukuwere moved swiftly. His plan was to force Mugabe to call for an elective congress, where he could dominate a weak field of rivals such as Chombo, Sekeramayi, and other unelectable candidates. Meanwhile, as National Political Commissar, Kasukuwere worked tirelessly on the ground, strengthening his support base—all in alignment with his Obama Project. Emmerson Mnangagwa had a strange accident in his white mercedes benz , then they tried cyanide (Kasukuwere had been fingered in cyanide use before as Minister of Environment) , then they tried poisoning Emmerson Mnangagwa using the same poison that poisoned David Karimanzira a Solomon Mujuru ally.

His path to power was carefully orchestrated, but in the unpredictable world of Zimbabwean politics, even the most cunning devil can miscalculate. November 2017 happened , we all know how that story goes, however not many know what has transpired thereafter and Kasukuwere's role in it all.



White City Explosion

Kasukuwere fled Zimbabwe in November 2017, allegedly fearing for his life, with reports of gunfire at his front gate. Yet, the same man who escaped under the cover of darkness later made a bold and highly publicized return to the very country where he claimed his life was in danger.

In May 2018, Kasukuwere jetted back into Zimbabwe, making a grand spectacle of his arrival. Strangely, no one questioned why he had returned, how he had left in the first place, or why he no longer feared those he once claimed wanted to kill him. Why?

Kasukuwere had returned with a mission—to orchestrate the White City explosion. In his mind, if he could eliminate President Emmerson Mnangagwa and General Chiwenga, there would be no doubt that he would become the next President of Zimbabwe.

In June 2018, just weeks after his return, an explosion rocked White City Stadium during a ZANU PF rally.

Kasukuwere had the financial resources, intelligence background, and security expertise to plan and execute such an operation with the help of trusted associates. As a former intelligence officer, he also understood how to bypass security systems and obstruct investigations to cover his tracks. Something to think about.



Mnangagwa Vs Chiwenga

Kasukuwere failed in his attempt to eliminate the ZANU PF Presidium at White City Stadium. Defeated, he retreated to his hideout in South Africa, where he began plotting his next move—a calculated effort to worm his way back into ZANU PF. His initial approach was through Ace Magashule and other proxies, hoping to negotiate his return.

However, the response was clear: follow procedure. He was instructed to write a formal letter requesting readmission, just as others before him—Didymus Mutasa, Ambrose Mutinhiri, Rugare Gumbo, Ignatius Chombo, and others—had done. But Kasukuwere, ever the schemer, demanded special treatment. When it didn't come, he pivoted to a new strategy: sowing discord between Mnangagwa and Chiwenga.

The 2019 Protests and Coup Rumors

In January 2019, what began as a legitimate protest was hijacked by rogue elements. These operatives—deployed and funded to create chaos—burned police vehicles, torched a police station, and engaged in violent acts completely foreign to Zimbabwe's usual protests.

Shortly after, rumors surfaced that General Chiwenga was plotting a coup against Mnangagwa. Kasukuwere's close associates, including Gomwe, publicly claimed they had been approached to support a plan to remove Mnangagwa.

The trap was then set for Claveria Chizema, an easy target. Kasukuwere orchestrated her downfall, ensuring that incriminating evidence was "discovered" at her home, framing her as a key player in the supposed coup plot.

The seeds of division had been planted.

General Chiwenga

The first phase of the scheme failed, forcing them to shift to Plan B—the poisoning of General Chiwenga and his prolonged illness. As Chiwenga battled for his health, rumors began circulating that Mnangagwa had poisoned him. These allegations, heavily pushed by Kasukuwere and his supporters on social media, soon gained traction.

Former G40 members seized the opportunity, adding their own twists and exaggerations, knowing that even those close to Chiwenga would begin to suspect foul play. Subtle incidents and well-placed misinformation made the rumors appear more credible, further deepening mistrust within the establishment.

Who Is Fueling the Infighting?

The most concerning aspect is that Kasukuwere remains at the center of these divisions, with his loyal foot soldiers leading the charge. Figures like Nyokayemabhunu Jeremiah Musiiwa (Mashonaland Central Province), Godfrey Tsenengamu, Godwin Gomwe, and others have been at the forefront, aggressively pushing his agenda.

Yet, critical questions remain unanswered:

- Why has no one questioned why both Mnangagwa and Chiwenga have been poisoned?
- Who was behind the White City Stadium attack that targeted both leaders?
- If Mnangagwa and Chiwenga have worked together for years, why would they suddenly turn against each other?

General Chiwenga himself was the first to propose Vision 2030 and constitutional amendments at a rally, even before Mudha or anyone else. Why then would Bombshell or any other figure now claim to speak on his behalf?

The Bigger Question

Who is driving a wedge between Zimbabwe's leadership—and what is their ultimate endgame?

Chamisa be vigilant

There is growing talk of deals being brokered by Kasukuwere. Whispers suggest he is the mastermind behind Blessed Geza and the coordinated press conferences by a faction of the War Veterans Association.

But history has shown that dealing with Kasukuwere always ends in betrayal. Joyce Mujuru is still nursing her wounds. Grace Mugabe is struggling to recover from the financial wreckage left in Kasukuwere's wake. Just ask Jonathan Moyo, Supa Mandiwanzira, or Walter Mzembi.

Mzembi's legal troubles in South Africa? Orchestrated by Kasukuwere—yet he still considers him a brother and ally. How tragic.

The Real Kasukuwere

Saviour Kasukuwere is like Paraquat—a toxic substance that should never be allowed near politics or power. He is a master manipulator, erasing his tracks while shifting blame onto others.
